Collaborative Partnership - Aims

- EU PA Guidelines
- EU Guidelines on Dual Careers of Athletes
- European Week of Sport
- Promote voluntary activity in sport
- Combat doping, notably in recreational environment
- Combat match-fixing
- Improve good governance
- Combat violence, racism, discrimination, intolerance
- Encourage social inclusion and equal opportunities

Small Collaborative Partnership - Aims

- Encourage social inclusion and equal opportunities
- Promote European traditional sports and games
- Support mobility of volunteers, coaches, staff
- Protect athletes from health and safety hazards
- Promote education in and through sport with special focus on skills development

- Sport competitions regularly organised by international, European or national sport federations/leagues

Both collaborative partnerships – eligibility

Public body or non-profit organisation established in a Programme or Partner Country

Applicant established in a Programme Country

At least 5 organisations from 5 different Programme Countries

At least 3 organisations from 3 different Programme Countries

Collaborative partnerships – eligibility

Maximum duration	From 12 to 36 months (12, 18, 24, 30, 36 months)	From 12 to 24 months (12, 18, 24 months)
Deadline	06/04/2017, 12 pm (midday) CET	06/04/2017, 12 pm (midday) CET

The activities must take place in the countries of organisations involved in CP.

- Non-profit vs. profit organisations
- Programme vs. Partner Countries
- Partner Countries vs. partner organisations

Not-for-profit European sport events – eligibility

Public body or non-profit organisation active in the field of sport established in a Programme Country

Participants from at least 12 different Programme Countries

Not-for-profit European sport events – eligibility

Start of the project	01/11/2017
Maximum duration	12 months
Deadline	06/04/2017, 12 pm (midday) CET

Not-for-profit European Sport Events - mistakes

- The number of participants from at least **12** Programme Countries
- The sending organisations must be clearly **identified** in the eForm

Call for proposals 2017 – co-financing

Sport action	Maximum grant
Collaborative partnerships	400 000 EUR
Small collaborative partnerships	60 000 EUR
Not-for-profit European sport events	500 000 EUR 300 000 EUR (EWoS)

eForm - mistakes

- **PIC** – each partner of collaborative partnership
- Not all information about partners come **automatically** from PIC
- **Eligibility** period





Budget - mistakes

- Not complete
- Vague, missing detailed information about costs
- Several budgets (per partner)
- Not in line with the eForm
- NEW: Unit costs!



Declaration of Honour (2 types)

Declaration of honour

- Applicant declares for all 'applicants' = beneficiaries/partners
- Name of action = name of project
- Point 5:
 - **For all** (except Member States and local authorities)
 - For each applicant = beneficiary/partner

Declaration of honour - mistakes

- No **signature**
- Signed by **other person** than the one in the eForm
- **Mandatory fields** not filled in
- Information not **readable**
- Different **amount** of grant requested than in the eForm

Submission

2 main ineligibility grounds

- Missed deadline



- Compulsory templates not included



Common mistakes

- Application sent **after deadline**
- **Midday** vs. midnight, CET - Brussels time
- **Mandatory fields** not filled in
- Application **not valid** for submission
- **Technical problems** not reported before deadline

What to do?

- Read the **Erasmus+ Programme Guide**
- Read the **Guidelines for applicants**
- Read the **FAQ**
- Download correct **compulsory templates** from EACEA Sport website

Write clearly, be precise and focused.


